ORDINANCE NO. 33 AN ORDINANCE

An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 32 or any other Ordinance or section or parts of any sections of any Ordinances, Adopted Oct. 4th, 1966 and entitled, "An Ordinance Providing For the Establishment Of A Volunteer Fire Department And Making Rules And Regulations For The Government Of The Same".

The Village Council of the Village of Minnesota City, Minnesota do Ordain:

SECTION I

Article 1. The Fire Department shall consist of a President, one Chief, one Assistant Chief, a Secretary, and a Treasurer, not less than seven (7) nor more than twenty-five (25) Active Firemen and not more than twelve (12) Associate Firemen. All members of the Department must be 21 years of age and not more than 40 years of age at the time of their election to membership.

Article 2. All Applications for membership made at any meeting of the Department shall be referred to a Committee of three members to be appointed by the Chief. Such Application shall lie over until the next meeting before being acted upon.

Article 3. The Chief, Assistant Chief, all Officers and active Firemen shall be residents of the Village of Minnesota City and will conduct the business and affairs of the Department. Non-resident Firemen will be Associate Firemen and will not participate in the conduct of the business and affairs of the Department.

Article 4. The President, the Chief and Assistant Chief shall constitute a Board of Fire Officers, who shall meet monthly or more frequently, if necessary, for the transaction of all business of the Department.

Article 5. The Board of Fire Officers is hereby authorized, empowered and required from time to time to adopt a code of by-laws and rules for the control, management and government of the Department and for the regulating of the proceedings and business of the said Board, which code or codes of by-laws and rules after adoption by such Board shall not become effective and operative until presented to and approved by the (Council) of the Village of Minnesota City.

Article 6. The Board of Fire Officers is hereby authorized, empowered and required to inspect from time to time, but at least twice annually all buildings and premises where accumulations of combustible materials or hazardous conditions are liable to exist, and to order such changes or removals as in their opinion are necessary to safety from fire. For purposes of inspection, they are hereby empowered to enter any and all buildings and premises at any reasonable hour.

Article 7. The Board of Officers is required to devise forms or methods of keeping records and shall see that records are kept of all alarms of fire, fire losses, methods of extinguishment, drills, hose, apparatus, minor equipment and condition of hydrants.

SECTION II

Article 1. The Chief shall be elected annually by the Resident Members of the Department at a meeting held in December, subject to confirmation by the Village Council. The approval of the Council shall be presumed unless the Council votes to remove such action at its regular meeting of January. All elections shall be held at the Department office at the January meeting. The Chief shall appoint the Assistant Chief, Associate Firemen and Treasurer by the Council Hearing.

Article 2. The Department shall be held in good standing if the Chief has not been removed for a period of one year.

Article 3. The members shall break out the alarm fire houses at the time of the fire. If the fire happens, the Chief in charge shall return to the fire house and clear the deposit.

Article 4. The fire house shall be kept in good order and the fire members shall be held responsible for the safekeeping of the fire house unless otherwise ordered by the Chief.

mediately report the condition of same to the Chief or Mayor, who is hereby empowered to have the same repaired at once.

SECTION IV

Article 1. Any member of the Department who shall refuse or voluntarily neglect to obey or execute any orders from the Officer in charge of any fire, or shall violate or willfully neglect or refuse to be controlled, governed or managed by any of the rules and by-laws of the Board of Fire Officers, that may be adopted from time to time as herein provided, shall be subject to suspension or expulsion from the Department by the Board of Fire Officers in such manner and upon such hearing or trial as may be prescribed or provided by the by-laws and rules of the Board of Fire Officers; the suspension or expulsion of any member being subject to the approval of the membership of the Department and the Council of the Village of Minnesota City.

Article 2. Any member who shall be guilty of using abusive or obscene language to any officer or member while in session, or on duty, or for incompetency, or for neglect of duty, shall be subject to expulsion by a two-thirds vote of the members present, at any regular meeting of the Department.

Article 3. If any of the Members shall vote for expulsion or suspension of any of its members, the result of such vote shall be reported to the Board of Fire Officers at their next meeting.

Article 4. The expelled or suspended member shall have the right to appear before the said Board of Fire Officers and Members and state cause (if any) why such penalty should not be confirmed, and in case of the non-appearance, or in case his appeal is not sustained, the Chief shall report his name to the (Council) of the Village of Minnesota City as expelled or suspended, as the case may be.

Article 5. In the event of a retrial being ordered by the (Council), the decision arrived at by the Board of Fire Officers at such retrial shall be final, conclusive and not subject to appeal.

SECTION V

Article 1. No person shall be allowed to enter any firehouse or handle any apparatus or implements belonging to the Department unless accompanied by an Active Member of the Department.

Article 2. No fire apparatus during any fire or the report of any fire shall be taken or moved out of its house unless at least two members of the Department to which the same shall belong shall be present.

Article 3. Every member shall have a key to the Fire Station. It will be his responsibility, in case he quits or moves or is expelled, to turn said key back to the Secretary, or, in case of a lost key, he will have to pay for same to get a new one.

SECTION VI

Article 1. If any Officer shall be absent for more than one meeting, it will be his duty to appoint an alternate in his absence.

Article 2. The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings in a book provided for that purpose and perform such other and further duties as may be required of him by the by-laws of the Department.

Article 3. The Treasurer shall receive and safely keep all the funds of the Department and pay the same as directed by a motion of the Department.
